While Three Rivers Partnership students are at any Partnership, Community Expert, or field trip location, they are expected to uphold the values and principles of the student handbook and District policy. Failure to do so will require disciplinary measures by administration in accordance with [District Policy 5600](#).

All students are required to agree to the terms of this Student Code of Conduct. This code of conduct is by no means exhaustive, but it does provide a synopsis of the framework of expectations we have for students in regard to conduct of a high standard of values, principles and ethics — virtues that we hope help them to succeed in more than just academics, to serve them well their entire lives.

The guiding principles in regard to student conduct are:

- Treat others with dignity and respect.
- Strive for excellence in everything you do.
- Be honest.
- Be kind.
- Be inclusive.
- Respect diversity.
- Take personal responsibility for your actions.
- Extend grace to others: no one is perfect.

Students should refrain from words and actions that impede learning and violate the guiding principles of conduct.
