A Parent/School Partnership Committee meets to share and discuss school improvement initiatives. Volunteers are requested or are selected by recommendations from the building school improvement team. We continue to utilize research in best practices to actively engage our parents in the SI process. At the building level our parent involvement is increasing. We attempt to hold meetings at various times of the day to offer options for all parents to participate.

We continue to seek increase stakeholder engagement. Strategy 1:

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) - Staff will increase student motivation and decrease inappropriate behavior through various age appropriate activities. PBIS is an empirically validated, function-based approach to eliminate challenging behaviors and replace them with prosocial skills. PBS can target an individual student or an entire school, as it does not focus exclusively on the student, but also includes changing environmental variables such as the physical setting, task demands, curriculum, instructional pace and individualized reinforcement. Thus it is successful with a wide range of students, in a wide range of contexts, with a wide range of behaviors.
